Dear Parents,

We have been advised that there has been 3 confirmed cases of COVID-19 within the school.

We know that you may find this concerning but we are continuing to monitor the situation and are working closely with Public Health England. This letter is to inform you of the current situation and provide advice on how to support your child. Please be reassured that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

Those families whose children have been in close contact with the individuals who have tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) have received a letter informing them that their child must stay at home and isolate for 10 days. However, whilst not all children will need to isolate a significant number of staff will need to and so unfortunately, this means we cannot safely open adhering to safeguarding guidelines even with cover staff. Therefore, the school will close on the last two days of term Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July and Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> July. We will be in touch to make sure that all items belonging to each child are safely stored and ready for collection in September. If you need to speak to us please ring the preschool site and we will get back to you as soon as possible.

We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause and assure you that at all times we are putting the health and safety of our children, families and staff first. We hope you enjoy the Summer as best as you can and keep safe and well. You have been a wonderful group of parents and carers to share this eventful year with and we thank you for all of the support, kindness and consideration you have shown us.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

















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If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not mix with others outside their home and should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for a PCR test (the normally available test type) and this can be arranged via <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test">https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test</a> or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The household isolation period includes the day the first person in your household's symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) and the next 10 full days. This means that if, for example, your 10 day isolation period starts on the 15th of the month, your isolation period ends at 23:59 hrs on the 25th and you can return to your normal routine.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family.

Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

















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Household members staying at home for 10 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community

If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period.

## **Symptoms**

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

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# How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

#### Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
